

Dana Lundquist (1979)

Funeral services will be held for Dana Lundquist who died Sunday when the motorcycle he was riding was stuck by a car. He had been on the way to visit friends.

He was born April 24, 1950, in Minneapolis, and came to Alaska in June 1951.

He was educated in Fairbanks public schools, received a bachelor's degree from the University of Alaska and in 1978 a Juris Doctor Degree from the law school of the University of Puget Sound in Tacoma, Wash.

He was admitted to the bar in Alaska and Washington and was entering the practice of law in Fairbanks with an affiliate office in the Seattle area. He was formerly a member of Operating Engineers Union Local 302 and held current membership in Laborer's Union Local 942.

He is survived by his parents, Dr., and Mrs. James A. Lundquist of Fairbanks; four brothers, Peter Eric, Andrew David, Willi Andrew and Jon Thomas; and two sisters, Mary Ann of Fairbanks, and Rebecca Ann (Mrs. Douglas L. Johnson) of Richfield, Minn.

He was preceded in death by a sister Patricia Susan, in 1966. He is survived also by a grandmother, Mrs. E. F. Lundquist of Minneapolis, numerous other relatives and friends in Alaska, western Canada, throughout the United States and in Sweden and Germany.
